

# Virtual Hoops and Hoopla Event Raises Money for Morgridge Academy at National Jewish Health

DENVER, CO — On April 2, supporters and friends tuned in for the National Jewish Health 2021 Hoops and Hoopla Virtual Tipoff & Trivia event presented by Greiner Electric. The event raised nearly \$110,000 for Morgridge Academy at National Jewish Health. Morgridge Academy is a free school for chronically ill children in kindergarten through eighth grade located on the campus of National Jewish Health. The Hoops and Hoopla virtual event was held on the eve of the NCAA Men's college basketball semifinal games.



"School is a big part of growing up, and you don't want to miss out," said Kris Wintroub, National Jewish Health Development Board Member and CFO at Greiner Electric. Morgridge Academy, operated by National Jewish Health, serves children living in metro Denver who have been diagnosed with a range of chronic health conditions that include severe asthma and allergies, diabetes, sickle cell anemia, HIV/AIDS, atopic dermatitis (eczema), juvenile rheumatoid arthritis, interstitial lung disease, cystic fibrosis and muscular disorders. With a dedicated team of teachers, nurses, a child advocate and a school counselor, the students receive a quality education while learning to manage their illnesses.

"We are incredibly grateful for our event 'coaches' who year-after-year dedicate their time and energy making this event a huge success," said Jennifer McCullough, Director of Education at Morgridge Academy. "The money raised at this event is so important in allowing us to provide a safe learning environment for our students."

The virtual program, hosted by former Denver Bronco and Altitude Sports radio host Ryan Harris, welcomed viewers from across Colorado and around the country. All who logged on were moved by the important program that featured messages from students and teachers, tributes from sponsors, and an annual video, "Rising to the Challenge," which highlights the tireless efforts to defeat COVID-19 made at National Jewish Health this past year.
