

National Jewish Named Best Respiratory Hospital in 2006

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DENVER, CO — For the ninth consecutive year, National Jewish Medical and Research Center has been named the #1 respiratory hospital in the nation by *U.S. News & World Report*. The ranking is part of the 2006 “America’s Best Hospitals” guide published by the weekly newsmagazine.

As part of the ranking, hundreds of board-certified pulmonologists around the country mentioned National Jewish more often than any other hospital when asked to name the best respiratory hospitals in the nation.

“We are gratified to have been named the best again,” said Michael Salem, MD, President and CEO of National Jewish. “All credit for this honor goes to our outstanding faculty and staff, whose expertise, hard work, professionalism, and dedication to our patients make National Jewish worthy of its # 1 ranking.

“We constantly strive to improve our knowledge and patient care. To that end, we recently began a comprehensive strategic planning process, which we believe will allow us to continue to lead the field in patient care, research, and education.”

U.S. News ranked hospitals’ respiratory programs based on their reputations among board-certified pulmonologists, as well as on mortality rates and care-related factors, such as nursing and patient services. National Jewish had the highest reputational score among all the respiratory hospitals evaluated. Allergy and immunology programs, which are also specialties of National Jewish, are not ranked by the newsmagazine.

The hospital rankings appear in the July 17, 2006, edition of *U.S. News & World Report*, which hits newsstands July 10. The rankings are also available on the website, <http://www.usnews.com/>.
