

More than \$2.3 Million Raised at Beaux Arts Ball to Benefit National Jewish Health

Denver, CO — On February 23, 2019, more than 1,100 people gathered at the 22nd Annual Beaux Arts Ball to raise \$2.3 million for National Jewish Health, the leading respiratory hospital in the nation. This year, the Beaux Arts Ball honored Grand Marshals Faye and Steve Demby, Kathleen and William J. Hybl, Wendy and Jimmy Miller, and Kate Paul and Michael Passmore for their unwavering support of National Jewish Health. The event, considered one of Denver's premiere fundraising events, was presented by the Morgridge Family Foundation.



Following a theme of "The World's Greatest Showman," the ballroom was transformed into a Big Top. As guests entered the room, they were greeted and entertained by acrobats rolling inside giant hoops, balancing acts, people on stilts, aerialists flying about the room and a fanfare of music and costumes. The entertaining theme led to serious business as the paddle-raising "fund-a-need" portion of the evening raised a record breaking \$760,000 for research and care of life threatening allergies.

During the evening's program, guests learned about the challenges facing children and adults with severe and unique allergies through the personal story told by Wyatt a 12-year-old from Helena, Montana, whose mother joined him to tell the hushed crowd about his struggle to breathe. Only at National Jewish Health was the cause of his illness finally identified and a plan put in place to help him.
